



Our Lady's Catholic Primary : MFL Teaching and Learning Policy

Coverage and Expectations

We follow the Language Angels Scheme of Work. MFL is to be taught for 1 hour per fortnight in KS2.

Each year group has a long-term plan showing the units and coverage is provided to deliver the national curriculum. This can be found on BGFL. There are 6 units per year group, one per half term.

Planning Expectations and Links

The long-term plans can be found on BGFL and currently we are following a 3-year plan.

All resources and planning can be found on Language Angels and is structured to deliver a progressive language development. Lessons must be taught in the order prescribed to ensure correct development.

Assessment and Feedback

Each unit begins with a unit marker which can be found in the planning folder for each year group. All are to be completed in each child's book, identifying whether objectives have been met. At the end of each unit these are revisited and completed.

Feedback will be mostly given verbally during the live lessons and throughout the journey of the units. Corrections will be made when marking is completed by the class teacher. Children should be given time to complete their corrections at the start of the next lesson.

Every unit should be completed by using the assessment sheet provided by Language Angels. This will test the children's speaking, writing, listening and reading for each unit.

Lesson Structure

Each lesson begins with the children writing the date in Spanish, LO and retrieval. The previous lessons vocabulary and grammar should be revisited before moving on. Each unit provides PowerPoint presentations with voice recordings to support teacher's delivery.

Environment

Each class room should have a small display to show their learning in the unit. This should include: A heading, some visuals and key vocabulary.

Presentation of work

Each unit will begin with a unit marker to show the unit title, unit objectives and statements.

This will then be followed by the unit glossary to support the children throughout the unit.

Each lesson will have the date in Spanish and LO to identify the objective being worked on and provide a chance for some retrieval.

As the unit progresses, children will move away from worksheets and into writing to develop their writing skills and give chance to revisit previous units and consolidate learning.

When using worksheets, they will need to be resized and trimmed down to fit horizontally in books to ensure presentation is of the highest standard.
