

PE & SPORT PREMIUM REPORT 2020-2021

SPORT PREMIUM FUNDING:

- **PURCHASE OF PRIMARY PE HUB RESOURCES** – Support planning and assessment to develop teacher confidence and range of resources available

IMPACT:

Staff have a clear overview of the PE curriculum; enabling them to clearly see the skills the children need to practise and develop across a series of lessons.

ASPIRE:

- **ASPIRE PECS Support for class teachers** (started in Autumn 2020) – improve confidence and planning in PE

IMPACT: R, Y1, Y2, Y3, Y4 Y5 and Y6 teachers/ teaching assistants supported from Aspire= increased their ability to plan and teach a sequence of PE lessons, identifying and assessing children's progress. Increased confidence, knowledge, and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

- **ASPIRE Lunchtime club** – increase range of activity available to pupils through basketball and multiskills club. Followed by Spring term (change of pupils to ensure maximum pupil participation in KS2).

IMPACT: Increased activity levels during lunchtime in KS1 and KS2, children developing their skills and confidence in a specific sport.

Aspire after school clubs- an opportunity for a chance to engage in a range of different sports: multiskills and hockey.

IMPACT: Children given the chance to develop their skills further and take part in a range of competitive sport.

- **Toddler Tennis after school sports club**- Reception and Year 1 children to take part in a range of multi skill activities.

IMPACT: Tailored to EYFS children- developing their gross motor skills, following instructions, confidence in participating in a range of sports and getting changed quickly into PE kits.

- **9TH June 2021- This Girl Can Hiit campaign**- whole school involvement- live workout through video can with John Henry Newman to promote girls being active.

IMPACT- The profile of PESSPA being raised across the school

- **5th July 2021- Aspire Tokyo Paralympic day**- Children to take part in whole school Paralympic style activities to celebrate the Olympics.

IMPACT: Increased activity for children, children to gain confidence and a more positive attitude towards an increasing range of sports. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.

- **KS2 Question and answer session with real Paralympian Ben Pritchard-** Years 3, 4 and 5 took part in a live zoom call with Ben as he discussed his journey to becoming a Paralympian and competing in the Tokyo Paralympics this year.

IMPACT: The profile of PESSPA being raised across the school

- **9th July 2021- Whole school football tournament-** Put together by a year 6 pupil to raise awareness of a local charity for homeless teenagers. All classes took part in a football competition and received medals/certificates.

IMPACT- Increased participation of all pupils in competitive sport

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS:

- To re-join with the Kingsbury Partnership going forward to support teaching and learning of PE.
- To promote healthy eating and lifestyle by running healthy eating workshops for all pupils.
- To organise a range of competitions with our local partner school Guardian Angels.
